Batphone- Cardiac Arrest



Is it within Mon-Fri 8am-5pm and Does it fit all eCPR Criteria:

- The cardiac arrest is likely to be of primary cardiac or respiratory cause
- The cardiac arrest was witnessed by a bystander or paramedic
- Chest compressions were commenced within 10 minutes
- The cardiac arrest duration (collapse to arrival at ED) has been < 60 minutes
- The patient is aged between 16-70 years
- There are no major co-morbidities that would preclude return to independent living
- •If non cardiac, the cause is likely reversible (eg hypothermia, overdose)
